**MATCH REPORT**

The afternoon was a different story. All bar one of the Cornish boys were long off the tee, Conor Warne, 11 years old, exceptionally so. A number of his drives hit the 280 yard mark or better! He also had a very sharp short game. In consequence George lost heavily. Harry made it to the 17th losing there to a par. Michael fought very well only to lose on the 18th, i down. It was a cracking match. Jake lost his way a little around the 12th to 14th and went down 4&2. Billie-Joe stuck to his guns and finally prevailed after halving the 18th to remain 1 up. Robbie conclusively beat Max Irwin 5&4 which could have been a much heavier defeat.

The boys kept going but one difference was the Cornish boys short games were that touch sharper. This is an important coaching point. I'm sure that when some of the lads get longer off the tee they will present considerably more difficulty to any team they meet.
